When he must choose between the two houses of jihad-War v. Peace, martyr v. moderate-he shifts from the former to the latter by virtue of an enthralling concept, thereby running afoul of both his Saudi mentor and their leftist allies, but not before his conflicted fiancée pays a price for her beauty-and for her independence.
